






6th Form Parents' Evening

Dear Parents and Carers,

We would like to invite you to take part in our first virtual 6th Form Parents' Evening on Thursday 28thth January from 4.00pm to 6.00pm. We are keen to work closely with Parents/Carers to support and secure the best outcomes for every child in Sixth Form and therefore the evening will provide you with an opportunity to hear from your child's subject teachers about their progress in lessons so far this year and how they can best progress.

Pupils will need to book a Strict 10 minute slot with their subject teacher.

Then:

- We will be using the Students TEAMS accounts to contact you
- 10 minute appointment will on TEAMS between the teacher and student (with the parent in attendance with the student).
- Students will 'receive' the call on TEAMS direct from the teacher. The teacher may invite HOY or HOD or SENCO where appropriate. By the teacher making the call clashes will be greatly reduced.
- It is important each meeting is strictly 10 mins.
- Students will be responsible for making appointments and will do this by emailing their teacher or during an on-line lesson with a time between 4.00pm and 6.00pm

From the Chaplain....

In the second instalment of Joseph's story we hear about him impressing his new boss who is an important member of Pharaoh's court in Egypt. Then suddenly he is thrown into prison when falsely accused of a crime he didn't commit. I was struck by the choice of words made by Potiphar's wife when she accused him: 'That Hebrew slave...' It is quite clear that although Joseph has shown that he is a capable manager, a man to be trusted with the running of Potiphar's household, when it comes down to it he is still a foreigner of no rank and therefore his voice is not heard.

Our world today is unrecognisable compared to the world Joseph inhabited and yet it is painfully obvious to us all that in matters of justice, we still have a long, long way to go. Slavery is still an issue in our country today. We still live alongside people whose voices are not heard and not valued. There are still people in our world today imprisoned and tortured for who they are or for what they believe rather than for any crimes committed. And we are aware that climate change has the biggest destructive impact on the poorest communities in the world. Because they are often far away, it can be easy for us to brush them aside as we focus on problems closer to home, and yet in the last twelve months we have also seen communities in our own country devastated by flooding.

This Sunday will be the International Day of Education. Not only is the right to education enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, but when the international community adopted the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development in 2015, they recognised that education is essential for the success of all 17 of its goals. As our leaders discuss ways to ensure our children and young people are nourished and equipped for learning, what can we do as parents and educators to ensure that every child in our care is inspired and empowered to participate fully in the moulding of a fairer world in the future?

Then, well in advance of the United Nations COP Environmental talks, to be held in Glasgow this November, The King's School will be celebrating an Eco Week at the start of February. Is there something more that we can do in terms of reducing our waste and encouraging bio-diversity around our school and our homes this year? How might we encourage our young people to dream big and to make a real difference to the environment around them, knowing that every little action taken will contribute to a change on a global scale?
