From the Chaplain.....

I can only imagine the thoughts that must have gone through Mary's mind when told that she was pregnant. Young, inexperienced and un-married, her situation would have brought shame and social isolation on herself and her family. Then there were all the practicalities to think about: young mothers-to-be today are encouraged to consider a birth plan but Mary was far from home, looking for a safe place to spend the night in a town where nobody wanted to offer her a bed. And the responsibility of having to care for and bring up and keep God's child safe must also have been quite overwhelming. On the other hand, God's people had been waiting for centuries for the Saviour God had promised to send to rescue and redeem his people and she, Mary, had been chosen to play a central role in his plan. What an honour!

Mary could have chosen to focus her thoughts on all the challenges she was faced with, and the hopeless situation her nation faced as a small, occupied territory, and to ask 'Where is God in all this?' This is how many of us react when faced with disaster, grief or unexpected challenges in our lives. Instead, Mary was able to see the bigger picture, and to recognise how blessed she was to have been chosen to play a role in God's story. And because of this, because she was open to recognising the amazing story of God's love in the world, because she trusted him to provide all she needed, because she understood he was entrusting a vital role to her, showing his faith in her; she was able to rejoice in his goodness.

I wonder if we are able to learn something from Mary's simple trust. Whether we too, in our moments of darkness, can ask not, 'Where is God in my story?' but 'Where am I in God's story?'

During our Christ the King Day Celebrations this week we considered how we, as individuals and as members of the King's School family, created in God's image and blessed with unique gifts and talents by him, might be used by him to transform the world around us. How we might accept his invitation to work with him to create a place where both the environment and all God's children might be valued, nurtured and enabled to flourish. As we turn our thoughts to Christmas and God's trust in humankind when he chose to come and live among us, vulnerable and limited as we are in a human body, let us remember that the story isn't over yet. God continues to show his love to his children today, and he chooses us to be a part of that story.
