From the Chaplain

Merry Christmas to you all and what a busy term! When I think back to all the new school members we have welcomed and enjoyed getting to know, the learning and conversations that have taken place, the talents that have been fostered and celebrated and the generosity that has been shown in our wide-ranging charity work I am amazed that it has only been four months! Our Christmas Services this week will focus on the birth of Jesus. When God reached out to humankind, sending his son to demonstrate the extent of his love for us, he didn't choose the comfortable and privileged setting of a royal palace. The divine child was born in quite unhygienic conditions, on a night when his human parents found themselves homeless. The new family were soon to become refugees, seeking safety abroad from the violence taking place in their own land. The child's first visitors would be shepherds, among the poorest and least respectable members of their society. Others to recognise the importance of the long-promised 'saviour of the Jews' would be foreigners, from distant cultures and faiths.

God's ways are not our ways and his values are not the values of the world. As we make our final preparations for our Christmas celebrations let us remember that God is not necessarily in the extravagant presents, decorations and food. If we want to welcome God this Christmas, we would do better to look instead among the homeless and the refugees, the excluded and the mis-understood.

God of the unexpected, friend of the poor: open our eyes to recognise you in our world today and our hearts to welcome you this Christmas time. Amen.
