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From the Chaplain.....

Happy New Year!

Nearly five hundred years ago the scientist Nicolaus Copernicus published his theory that, contrary to popular belief at the time, it was the Sun, and not the Earth, around which the nearby planets revolved. Similarly, we sometimes need reminders that we ourselves are not at the centre of the universe, but rather that we were each created and blessed with individual talents and roles to play in God's greater plan.

As we consider the journey and the gifts offered by the Wise Men visiting the young child Jesus this week, we are also reflecting on the gifts with which each of us has been blessed. Often we are shy and reluctant to draw attention to our talents, preferring the comfort of anonymity, and we can be blind to seeing the full potential in other people we know well. Unintentionally we are limiting what we will achieve both as individuals and as a community. So in order to achieve our God-given potential and become the people we were created to be let us seek to have open eyes and minds to noticing and encouraging gifts in ourselves and in each other that they might be shared and used for the benefit of the whole community.
