




This week as part of National Careers Week we have ran two main events for National Careers Week, a Careers Fayre for KS3 students and Virtual Work Experience for students in years 11,12 and 13.

On Wednesday we welcomed guest exhibitors to our Careers Fayre from Willmott Dixon (construction and property company), St Modwen (property development company), Halesowen College, and the University of Hertfordshire. Students were given time to independently visit the in-house careers fayre that was hosted on our VLE, with assignments being given on TEAMS to complete whilst visiting the fayre.



From the Chaplain....

Most of us would rather be told the truth, even if it is painful, than be comforted with half-truths designed to make us feel better. And yet, when we are the ones in the position of having to share the truth, the decision of what to say and what to withhold doesn't seem quite so clear cut. Part of us wants to shield our loved ones from the pain of what we have to tell them. And if we are really honest, part of us wants to avoid the discomfort of telling them and witnessing their reaction.

'Fake news' was added to the Oxford English Dictionary in October 2019 and, although the term may have been popularised by a certain former American President during his 2016 presidential election campaign, there are examples of its use dating back to the 1890s. Our lives are increasingly lived out online, and never more so than during the recent lock downs. Screen time interactions make it easier than ever to put on a mask and present only the image we want people to see, or indeed to hide behind a blank screen and withdraw from all but an absolute minimum of interaction with the outside world. For some, this has served to increase the sense of loneliness and isolation they are experiencing and in particular for many teenagers, for whom interaction with their peers and others plays a particularly important role in helping them form their sense of identity. For many, the idea of returning to public life, with or without face masks, is quite a daunting prospect.

Whilst we may have become quite adept at censoring the face we present to the world on screen and at recognising the filters which have been applied to the news reports, stories and information we ourselves digest via a range of media, there is now a recognisable longing for an experience which is real; for a deeper truth.

When Jesus talked to his disciples about the suffering he would soon face and his eventual death, they didn't want to hear. But instead of avoiding a difficult conversation, Jesus gently persisted in getting his friends to face up to the painful truth of what would happen, and the sacrifices they themselves would have to make as his followers. His courage and honesty with his friends made him vulnerable, but also opened up a possibility of a deeper connection between them: more truthful, more loving and more real.

For many of our pupils the world is now a place in which sudden, dramatic change can be imposed on them by a distant politician, where they feel they have no power over decisions which turn their lives upside down and where nothing they experience seems real. If we want to build strong relationships with one another, which hold us firm as a family and which ultimately support our pupils in re-engaging with the world outside their bedrooms, we may have to do as Jesus did and model openness and honesty in the face of difficult questions. We will feel vulnerable at times, we may have to admit to not knowing the answers at times; but our rewards will be in the strength of the bonds we form and the depth and 'realness' of the experiences we create.
