

### Key messages for Parents & Carers from Public Health England & City of Wolverhampton Council.

Please notify school as soon as your child displays symptoms.

Do not send children to school with symptoms (no matter how mild).

Do not send children to school whilst awaiting a test result.

Do not attend your GP or A & E for a test-testing is not available at these locations, visit:

#### www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test.

Obtain a test for your child as soon as possible and notify school of the result.

If no test is obtained, the child is unable to return to school until the end of the 10 day isolation period.

Ensure all symptomatic individuals isolate for 10 days and other household members isolate for 14 days.

Tests are not required for household members who do not have symptoms.

### From the Chaplain....

I wonder what are the things that sap your energy and make you feel tired and frustrated? I wonder when the last time is that you questioned the wisdom of a decision, or that you even questioned why God would allow certain suffering or misfortune to take place? Our reading this week from Isaiah 40 starts by reminding us how far beyond our own understanding are God's wisdom and power:

Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand, or with the breadth of his hand marked off the heavens? Who has held the dust of the earth in a basket, or weighed the mountains on the scales and the hills in a balance? Do you not know? Have you not heard? He sits enthroned above the circle of the earth, and its people are like grasshoppers.

I love the image of mankind looking like tiny insects from the heavenly throne. But there is more. Though we may not understand God's reasons or see the full scope of his plans, we are called to trust him. If we can trust that God is at work in our lives, we start to notice and be glad of the little joys in life that he blesses us with. And as we notice more, we trust more and we are glad more.
