

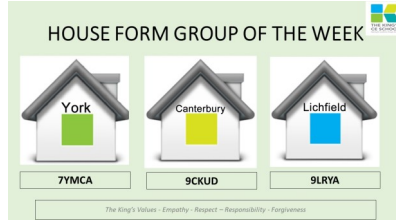

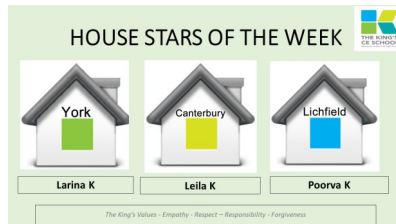

Make school attendance a priority

What you can do:

- Talk about the importance of showing up to school everyday, make that the expectation.
- Help your child maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Try not to schedule dental and medical appointments during the school day.
- Don't let your child stay home unless genuinely unwell.

97% attendance =
6 school days missed per year = 36 lessons

95% attendance =
9.5 school days missed per year = 57 lessons

90% attendance =
19 school days missed per year

95% attendance over 5 years =
285 missed lessons (2.5 grades less than expected at GCSE)
