
We are busy starting to organise for our next events: Chocolate/Easter egg Tombola - 17th March 2020 Year 7 Disco - Friday 20th March 2020

From the Chaplain......

Suffering pain. Suffering disappointment. Suffering humiliation. Suffering bereavement. These are all part of our common human experience, and yet can cause us to feel very alone, very isolated. Our Bible story this week tells of the plagues suffered by the Egyptians as Pharaoh refused to release the Hebrew people from captivity. For those of us who have grown up with the image of a loving, merciful and benevolent God the idea of a god who punishes and causes suffering might seem quite alien. Nonetheless, the reality of God allowing suffering to take place cannot be denied. Knowing that the challenges in life are what shape us, transforming us into more tolerant, resilient and generous human beings, may not be much comfort at the time. Knowing that God himself came and suffered on Earth as humans do and knows what we are going through, might help a little.
