Curriculum

As a Church School, Religious Education and collective worship both play an important part in the life of our school. We respect the richness and diversity of everyone in our school community and Christian values are central to all aspects of our school life. We respect and celebrate all other religions whilst expecting all of our students to take part in the school's celebrations of key Christian events and this includes attendance at local churches. These events we believe are at the core of what makes our school community unique.

We aim to broaden our students' horizons by adding new challenges and opportunities through both our curriculum and extra-curricular activities. All our students have access to a wide and varied range of experiences. A residential outward bound week in year 7, the Duke of Edinburgh scheme our school production, are only a small sample of activities our students can take part in. Ofsted agreed the school offers a wide range of extra-curricular opportunities.

Key Stage 3

We deliver a differentiated curriculum providing appropriate challenges and flexibility to meet the needs of all our students. All students study the core subjects of English, Mathematics and Science as well as a wide range of other subjects including a foreign language, Art, Technology, History, Geography, ICT, Music and RE. By the end of Year 9 our students are able to make informed decisions about the pathway they will follow in Key Stage 4.


Key Stage 4

At Key Stage 4 our Ofsted inspection recognised we provide pupils with the chance to follow a broad and balanced curriculum, offering a wide range of qualifications and experiences. We have excellent links with our partner schools, ensuring our students have access to a wide range of qualifications including vocational and applied courses so that we can meet the need and aspirations of all our students.

Post 16

We are delighted that the majority of our students remain with us in our 6th Form where we work in a consortium with many schools to provide a comprehensive range of courses. Students not only have access to the traditional A Level courses but also to vocational and applied courses. We work closely with local universities and have a proven track record of our students going to study at Oxbridge and other top universities as well as securing high quality apprenticeships. All of this ensures our students understand the opportunities which lie ahead of them and are prepared to make the right choices at the end of the 6th Form.

Ofsted recognised that students in our sixth form are well motivated and enjoy their learning.



Using creativity and imagination to improve confidence

Our Performing and Visual Arts are a recognised strength of the school. We give great importance to providing opportunities to develop all types of creativity.

Creativity is developed across the whole curriculum to harness values and give expression to skills, talents and ideas. From year 7 these subjects are used as a powerful stimulus for our teaching and learning, influencing, informing and underpinning the whole curriculum. We want our students to develop their imagination, becoming resourceful and confident as well as creative.
