

From the Chaplain.....

I write this at the end of one whole week of 'normal' lessons. I say normal, but nothing is quite the same as we all try to settle into new and different routines in order to keep everyone safe. This week pupils have been invited to come to the school garden to reflect. They have considered some of the sadness and frustration they have experienced in past months as they tied ribbons to a tree to remember their losses. They also reflected on their hopes and prayers for the next few weeks and for our school community as we seek to re-connect with one another and move forwards together.

Our worship this term focusses on some of God's promises to us, his people. This week we have been re-telling the story of Abraham, to whom God promised countless descendants through whom all nations would be blessed. But Abraham had to leave his country and his people and set out on a long journey to a distant land, where he and his wife Sarah would wait many years until their old age before God's promise was fulfilled. Abraham certainly earned his title 'the father of faith'.

We may not have travelled any great physical distance but there is a sense in which our journey through the last few months has brought us into a strange place: an unfamiliar way of life. We hold fast to the hope that the current restrictions will not last forever. We trust that the day will come again when we will once more be able to meet for family celebrations, to take off our masks and smile openly at one another, to hug our friends and family, to visit our elderly relatives and to go about our daily lives without fearing crowded spaces.

As summer turns to autumn, the days shorten and the news stories tell us of infection rates rising, let us hold on to God's promise that whatever happens he loves us and wants to bless us. And let us stand firm in our belief that the day is coming when 'All shall be well, and all shall be well and all manner of things shall be well'. (Dame Julian of Norwich)
