

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From the Chaplain....

In addition to celebrating the huge variety of languages we speak across the school, this week has been an opportunity for us to think a bit deeper about the way we communicate, and in particular, how we communicate with God. We all know the problems that miscommunication can cause and we will have experienced times when it is difficult enough to communicate our meaning clearly with our nearest and dearest. Many of us will have experienced trying to communicate our needs to speakers of other languages, whether in our hometown or abroad on holiday. Some of us might even, at times, speak to other species: to our pets or even our plants, though we probably don't expect them to answer us! So how do we, limited, physical beings at this particular point in time and space, communicate with a Spiritual being who is both timeless and imminent, higher and greater than we can imagine and yet closer to us than our own breath: how do we communicate with him? And does he, with the whole universe in his hand, even have the time to listen?

Perhaps it might help us to remember the words of Psalm 139:

O LORD, you have examined my heart and know everything about me. You know when I sit down or stand up. You know my thoughts even when I'm far away. You see me when I travel and when I rest at home. You know everything I do. You know what I am going to say even before I say it, LORD. You go before me and follow me. You place your hand of blessing on my head. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too great for me to understand!

Even before we speak to him, God already knows what is in our hearts and on our minds. He knows everything about us: the good, the bad and the ugly; and he still loves us. There is nothing that we can say which will ever change that fact. We can be assured that we can come before God with total honesty, we can rejoice or we can lament, we can tell him of our struggles and we can ask him for his help; he will hear us and he will care. Or if words fail us, we can just sit in silence with him; because he knows.

I leave you with the prayer Jesus taught his disciples from The Message:

Our Father in heaven, reveal who you are.
Set the world right;
Do what's best— as above, so below.
Keep us alive with three square meals.
Keep us forgiven with you and forgiving others.
Keep us safe from ourselves and the Devil.
You're in charge! You can do anything you want!
You're ablaze in beauty! Yes. Yes. Yes.
