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From the Chaplain....

I think most of us can probably sympathise with the apostles in our reading this week, as we find them still shut away in hiding, scared to go out, several weeks after Jesus' death and resurrection. It is now the time of the Jewish Festival of Weeks and Jerusalem is once again swarming with tourists. The Holy Spirit seeks out the apostles in their hiding place and fills them with great courage, inspiration and excitement. They burst out into the streets and start to proclaim the good news about everything that has happened to them. No longer are they afraid, no longer do they need to hide away. This is one of my favourite stories in the Bible. Partly because as a linguist I am in awe of the way that the apostles were able to communicate in such a wide range of foreign languages. But partly because of that promise that Peter quotes from the prophet Joel; that God will pour out his Spirit on everyone: rich and poor, old and young, women and men, servants and land-owners... everyone. As we begin the easing of our lockdown rules some of us may also feel ready to burst out of our homes full of energy and excitement, but many will feel more cautious about coming out of a safe space into situations where we have less control. Yet others will be worried about the uncertain financial and employment situation, or about family members who are ill or isolated.

God's gift of his Holy Spirit will work in us in different ways. Some he will comfort, some he will encourage, some he will inspire or enthuse: each according to his or her need. What we can be sure of, is that whatever frame of mind we find ourselves in, whatever individual challenges we are faced with, whether we are aware of him or not; God has promised us that he will be with us always and never leave us, until the end of time.
