#### 1. Introduction

In December 2020 the Regional Schools Commissioner approved an application submitted by the Diocese of Lichfield for Three Spires Trust to form and for the first four schools to progress forward with their transition to the Trust.

#### The approval included:

- I. agreement to The King's CE School, Kidsgrove, St Thomas CE Primary School, Kidsgrove and The King's CE School, Wolverhampton to become academies and join Three Spires
- II. confirmation that S. Peter's CE Collegiate School could move from a single academy to join as a member of the new academy trust

One of the first priorities in this phase is stakeholder consultation. Consultation commenced on the 25 January 2021 and concluded on the 26 February 2021 and views have been sought from parents and carers, pupils, staff, trade unions, the community and partners. Further within the report we have shared a breakdown of meetings that happened, communications which were issued, and a copy of all feedback received as part of the process. In addition to these meetings further meetings have been scheduled in response to requests from stakeholders. Due to the Covid 19 Pandemic all consultation was virtual using Microsoft Teams as the vehicle to host the meetings.

The Schools involved as part of the consultation were:

- St Thomas' CofE Primary School, Staffordshire\*
- The King's Kidsgrove CofE School, Staffordshire\*
- S Peter's Collegiate, Wolverhampton
- The King's CofE School, Wolverhampton



# 2. Consultation Methodology

The overall aim of the consultation process was to ensure that everyone who has a stake in the decision of the schools to become Academies and form a multi academy trust had the opportunity to hear about the plans, to share their views and ask any questions.

The objectives of the process were to:

- 1. Provide relevant background information for stakeholders
- 2. Explain the reasons for the proposal
- 3. Set out the stages in the process for the schools to become academies, to form a multi academy trust and the associated timelines
- 4. Listen to those participating and answer questions raised
- 5. Engage in a dialogue and develop relationships

The principles laid down by the project team for the consultation were that it should be:

- An open and transparent process
- Accessible to all stakeholders in terms of:
  - The times of the events
  - The language used (jargon-free wherever possible and acronyms fully explained)
  - o Well-publicised

A variety of media were used to consult including:

- Direct letters
- Text messaging
- Publicised meetings involving presentations and questions and answer sessions
- Frequently asked questions and comments slips
- Online surveys
- Dedicated consultation email account
- School websites (See Appendix 1a, 1b, 1c)

#### 2.1 Direct letters

Letters introducing the consultation were sent to the following groups and are included in Appendix 2a i, ii, iii, iv, 2b i, ii, ii, iv, 2c i, ii, iii.

- Governors
- Parents/Carers/Community members
- School Staff
- Trade Unions

Parent/Carer and Community letters were also posted on each school website.





#### 2.2 Online survey

Google Surveys were used as an online tool to provide everyone with an opportunity to have their say and to gauge reaction and opinion to the proposal to covert to academy status and form a multi academy trust.

#### 2.4 Staff, Parent/Carer and Community Meetings

At each of the consultation meetings a presentation was given with information about why the schools were proposing to convert to academy status (for S. #### 2.5 Frequently asked questions (FAQs) and comment slips

#### 2.6 Consultation Email

A dedicated email account was set up (<u>consultation@threespirestrust.org</u>) to capture feedback, respond to questions and facilitate attendance at virtual meetings. Stakeholders were able to confirm attendance and in turn were issued a link to the relevant meeting they wished to attend.



# 5. Themes and Key Messages

Appendix 5 contains all the questions, comments and feedback received from the various consultation events / media used throughout the consultation period. A summary of all the responses and the messages contained therein, with implications for the Trust and / or schools are provided in the remainder of this section.

Stakeholders are most interested in:

#### 5.1 Maintaining identity and feeling a sense of ownership

Stakeholders were keen to highlight that the school's individual identities should be kept as is, this included school names, uniforms, vision values and Church of England status. There was a nervousness for some that a move to a multi academy trust would mean major changes and that identity would be diluted.

#### 5.2 Three Spires Trust, governance and leadership

The Trust is new and without a tried and tested background, stakeholders are keen to understand what systems and processes will be in place ready for when the schools join. Clarity was sought on:

- o What governance structures will look like at an individual school level
- Who will be responsible for what across all levels of the structure?
- Further detail on Three Spires and the Trustees and leadership who will be accountable for all schools
- Strategic direction what is the five year plan? Will there be future growth?

#### 5.3 Staffing / employment matters

Many staff sought clarification and assurance around any proposed changes and what it would mean for them personally. A whole school communication (see Appendix 6) was issued in February to help allay some of the nervousness which exists amongst staff and we have continued to meet with staff and answer questions as they arise.

The main themes for staff were surrounding:

- o TUPE
- The possibility of having to work in other schools
- Contractual changes to terms and conditions
- Pensions
- Non contractual detail for example childcare voucher and cycle to work schemes
- o Introduction of a Trust / Trade Union Recognition Agreement





#### 5.4 Education

Stakeholders sought assurance around the quality of education and that the Trust were not planning to change staffing and curriculum structures, as well as practical aspects like whether or not the school days would change, term times and holidays etc.

Questions were raised in writing and at meetings about whether the Trust planned to merge the Wolverhampton schools and have one CofE secondary school for the city and this was confirmed not to be the case.

There was a theme surrounding the primary school and whether they felt this proposal was in the best solution for the school as they would be the only primary school. The relationship between primary and secondaries overall were explored and stakeholders could see the benefit of being in a Trust that had both age ranges within it.

#### 5.5 Finance / capital investment

Many questions were received about finance and how this would work day to day within the Trust. Areas of interest included:

- On a practical level how does funding work for an academy and a Trust
- What would the central charge be and what services would be provided to schools?
- What would schools retain responsibility for and what finance tasks would be done centrally?
- o How will economies of scale be realised?
- o Will it cost more?
- Financial challenges at one of the schools linked to buildings issues
- Will the Wolverhampton schools get the support they need to address buildings issues?

# **5.6 Communication and Engagement**

For some stakeholders they reported feeling the process of conversion was feeling rushed and it was going too fast and there was a lot of information to digest in a short period of time.

The challenge surrounding the virtual nature of the consultation has meant the schools leadership, governors and the Three Spires Trust have facilitated a variety of routes for engagement and communication which has included:

- Meetings for groups and individuals
- o Direct contact with HR representatives and Trade unions
- Opportunity to complete an online survey
- Ability to email questions
- Access to updated information throughout the process via school websites

Stakeholders do not want communication channels to dry up or stop just because the formal consultation period has ended. Receiving regular updates is essential.





Engagement with pupils has been mixed and all schools received some feedback using the methods above however, when they return to school on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March each school will facilitate ongoing engagement with all pupils and this will be done by using appropriate communications and fedback to the Trust from each of the schools.

#### 6. Conclusion and Recommendations

On compilation of all feedback and data received, the conclusion that can be drawn is that there are no apparent legitimate reasons why the new MAT cannot be established according to the timescales outlined however, further consideration should be given to the perceived speed the transition is happening at.

For some there is a view that this will be a positive move for the schools, but this is not yet shared widely amongst all stakeholder groups and it is important to recognise the ongoing dialogue is going to be extremely important.

Work with pupils was limited due to the lockdown, further work should be undertaken when they return on the 8<sup>th</sup> March (see recommendations below).

Response rates overall to the consultation were excellent especially considering the virtual nature of the process. Over 350 comments or questions were raised in the consultation from a cross section of the communities the schools serve, and the feedback should now inform the Trust communications strategy and plan in order to inform the journey and bring stakeholders with you.

Following the completion of the consultation period for all schools proposing to join the MAT it is recommended that:

- 1. All schools proceed with the next phases of the joining process
- 2. A range of media are used to further inform stakeholders of all the milestones and timescales and plans for the MAT as they progress. Communication should be ingoing, clear and timely.
- 3. Communications strategy and plan should be generated by the Trust
- 4. Due diligence and financial modelling is completed and information shared with each school and actions plans subsequently put in place
- 5. Each school consults with pupils in greater detail on their return to school from the most recent national lockdown and the outcomes are shared with the Trust. A pupil consultation report/newsletter should be collated to summarise findings and any actions
- 6. Clarity is provided on the Trust financial data and planning and how this will work operationally in schools.
- 7. Governance structures are completed and populated with named individuals with associated clarity provided on terms of reference and responsibilities
